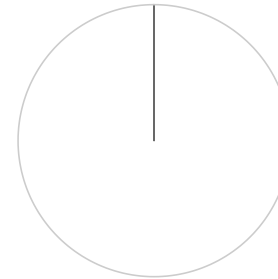

SUBMITTED SHORT ANSWERS

Question	Explain the challenges Newtok's residents are experiencing.
Example	Student answers will vary. Students should explain that climate change is causing flooding and erosion, which is destroying homes and buildings. The residents are being forced to move and the community is being separated because not enough new houses are available. Climate change is causing permafrost to melt in Newtok, which is causing many problems for the residents. Flooding and erosion has "caused the land around their homes to crumble and sink" (Paragraph 3). The government has been slow to help, so residents have gone without plumbing for decades. "The lack of proper sanitation has led to health problems, especially among infants" (Paragraph 11). Since their homes are being destroyed, residents have started moving to Mertavik, but "it will probably take until at least 2023 before enough homes are built for everyone" (Paragraph 6). The new homes do not "yet have access to public water or sewer systems" (Paragraph 14). The community will be living in two places, while trying to maintain one community. Residents of Newtok are experiencing the devastating effects of climate change and facing the challenges head on.

Hannah Dain	Because of climate change, there has been lots of flooding and houses destroyed in Newtok. Some people will have to stays in Newtok, while others will go to the the village of Mertarvik, a village the people are creating on higher ground do to flooding, causing them to be seperated. 1/3 of the 60 homes they need have been built. They have electricity, but no running water or access to sewer systems.

Feedback for Varshini	
Sanai Riley	Climate change has effected this Alaskan Village by causing homes to be at risk of collapsing, damaged fuel storage tanks, and lots of flooding. Since the people living in Newtok no longer have access to energy-efficient homes, they will need to move to a better village with a safer environment. The need to move is causing the people to have separation anxiety and mixed feelings about leaving the place they've known in all their life. The government has also made this experience more challenging, by not providing people with a new home to live in. This problem is causing families without proper water to drink, and health issues. Lastly, while new homes have started to be built and provided for the people, there is still no money to install running water and a sewage system, and it could take many years to be addressed for all.
